

Cash SUD 2023 Annual Drinking Water Quality Report

The State of Texas and federal government requires testing of our drinking water to ensure its health & safety. Each year Cash SUD closely monitors the water both at the source and throughout our system. Samples are collected and tested at different intervals; some testing is done monthly, quarterly, annually, and there are a few specific samples that are only taken every few years.

Cash Special Utility District's annual drinking water quality report (or consumer confidence report) communicates the results of those tests to our customers every year. The report covers the analysis of samples that were taken January 1 through December 31, 2023.

Cash SUD's drinking water surpassed the strict regulations of both the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).


2024 Summer Watering Schedule

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Improvements to the Cash Special Utility District infrastructure continue! The new Union Valley Pump Station and ground storage tank construction has begun; the Union Valley pump station will pump up to 1,800 gallons of water per minute. The Union Valley project will also include two 500,000 gallon ground storage tanks.

These additions to the Cash SUD infrastructure will help ensure quality water service for all our new and existing customers in the area.

What is PFAS?

You may be starting to hear/see information coming out about perfluoroalkyl or polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS); these are a group of synthetic chemicals that are resistant to heat, water, grease and oil. According to the FDA, "They were first used in the 1940's and are now in hundreds of products including stain- and water-resistant fabrics and carpeting, cleaning products, paints, and fire-fighting foams."

Scientific studies have shown that exposure to some PFAS in the environment may be linked to some harmful health effects in humans and animals. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is introducing some limits and recommendations on how much PFAS are considered safe in our environment. PFAS are measured in parts per billion (ppb). One part per billion is the equivalent of one drop of water in three (3) Olympic size swimming pools put together. Water utilities around the country are now testing for PFAS levels and working to find a way to better remove them from our water sources; this will be a work in progress for all water utilities across the country.

At this time, our water is safe and meets all state/federal requirements. The safety of our drinking water for all of our customers is of the utmost importance to Cash SUD.
